# Growing in Faith Through Stewardship

"We give thee but thine own, What're the gift may be, All that we have is thine alone, A trust O Lord from thee"

This little offertory hymn was written in 1858 by William Walsham How and published in 472 hymnals over the years. Some members of Faith are old enough to remember singing it as the offertory hymn in one of the Divine Services of our youths, I certainly do or would not have been able to remember it verbatim without looking it up. It must predate the old red Lutheran Hymnal as it was not used in either the page 5 or 15 services. But none of that is the point of this message, it just helps set the context.

As short as this little verse is, its message is powerful.

The first line clearly states that everything we have belongs to God. It is merely on loan to us to manage wisely in effective stewardship.

The second line makes no distinction on the size or value of the gift, be it time, talent, or wealth. In the Old Testament God established the tithe as the required contribution of the first fruits of our bounty. Jesus in His stewardship messages did not abolish the tithe, He admonished us to make our contributions with a cheerful heart. He contrasted the wealthy Pharisee's gift with that of the Widow and her mite, stating he gave of his wealth to publicly brag while she gave of all she had and thus her gift was much more valuable than his.

The third line establishes that everything we have is a gift from God, our bounty, the talent we have that enables us to earn it and the ability to manage it responsibly.

Finally, the fourth line makes it clear that what God has entrusted to us is to be managed with responsible stewardship. A short, direct, and powerful message. When we at Faith view our stewardship responsibilities in this light, we are encouraged to contribute our time, talent and bounty with a cheerful heart and thus reap the benefits of growing in faith.

# Housewarming Shower for Tiny Homes

Faith's Women's Guild is sponsoring a housewarming shower for one of the tiny homes being built in Eustis on Grove St. Forward Paths Foundation is building 10 tiny homes to house youths who are aging out of foster care at age 18. Some teens are abandoned by their parents and left to navigate on their own. They are enrolled in high school but have no permanent housing or adult supervision. They must find a job, a place to live, and transportation. Without help, very few have the resources or life skills to become successful. One in four of these youths end up incarcerated according to DCF. Forward Paths mission is to provide temporary housing, mentors to help with job skills/finding jobs, education, counseling, materials for everyday living, and donations for necessary items such as a birth certificate, drivers license, uniforms for job or school, etc. Since the tiny homes are in our own backyard, the opportunities to help this excellent organization are limitless. They are hoping to have a grand opening around May 1<sup>st</sup>. Since we believe that each home will already have furniture, our goal is to provide the rest: bedding, towels and bathroom items, stock a kitchen with dishes, pots and pans, etc. We have established a list which will be in the Narthex for folks to sign up to donate an item or two, if you wish. Please go to their website at forwardpaths.org to learn more about this unique organization that is providing such necessary and blessed relief for unhoused youth.
