Stewardship

Growing in Faith Through Stewardship

Exodus 35:4-5 – "Moses said to all the congregation of the people of Israel, 'This is the thing that the Lord has commanded. Take from among you a contribution to the Lord. Whoever is of a generous heart, let him bring the Lord's contribution" ...

The context of this passage is the Lord giving Moses regulations for the Sabbath. Part of these regulations deal with contributions to the Tabernacle. He goes on to list all the things that can be used for acceptable contributions, precious metals like gold and silver, beautiful cloths of royal colors, tanned skins, fine oil, and rare woods etc. The key phrase in this regulation about contributing to the Tabernacle (church) is .."whoever is of a generous heart"... implying that a generous heart is required for an acceptable contribution. Earlier evidence of this command was Cain's contribution which was, apparently. made grudgingly, and thus rejected by God in favor of Abel's. This command speaks to us at Faith as well as it did to the people of Israel under Moses's leadership. When we give with a generous heart, the first fruits of our labors, we too will find our contributions to the mission of the church graciously acceptable to God and realize growth in faith via the Holy Spirit.

Housewarming Shower for Tiny Homes

Faith's Women's Guild is sponsoring a housewarming shower for one of the tiny homes being built in Eustis on Grove St. Forward Paths Foundation is building 10 tiny homes to house youths who are aging out of foster care at age 18. Some teens are abandoned by their parents and left to navigate on their own. They are enrolled in high school but have no permanent housing or adult supervision. They must find a job, a place to live, and transportation. Without help, very few have the resources or life skills to become successful. One in four of these youths end up incarcerated according to DCF. Forward Paths mission is to provide temporary housing, mentors to help with job skills/finding jobs, education, counseling, materials for everyday living, and donations for necessary items such as a birth certificate. drivers license, uniforms for job or school, etc. Since the tiny homes are in our own backyard, the opportunities to help this excellent organization are limitless. They are hoping to have a grand opening around May 1st. Since we believe that each home will already have furniture, our goal is to provide the rest: bedding, towels and bathroom items, stock a kitchen with dishes, pots and pans, etc. We have established a list which will be in the Narthex for folks to sign up to donate an item or two, if you wish.
