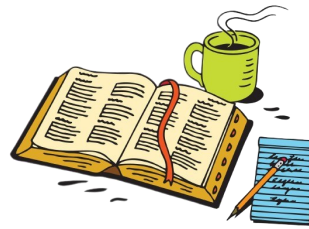

Letter from the Pastor

Dear friends in Christ,

I have been crying a lot recently. It's weird when it happens, because sometimes I don't know why. There is some latent PTSD. I believe I have effectively kept past traumatic experiences buried deep down, but then they come to the surface and manifest in tears rolling down my cheeks. So that may be partly to blame.

There have been some recent deaths of

members of the congregation that I have pastored for over 15 years, a year longer than the oldest kids I teach at school have been alive, so there's that. There have been my tears of frustration of not being able to be the super man pastor some think I am and not being able to solve their problem and watch people I love suffer because I couldn't do anything to help them like I wanted to.

Then there is the grievous pushback that I

have gotten when I have simply told the truth. I get the push back, truth hurts, and I am prepared for the push back, but maybe don't take full stock of how that can hurt, even someone like me! Since I've had my heart issues (for those of you that don't know my lower ventricle stopped working and the other three chambers are doing all the heavy lifting for now), one of my dear friends joked that my

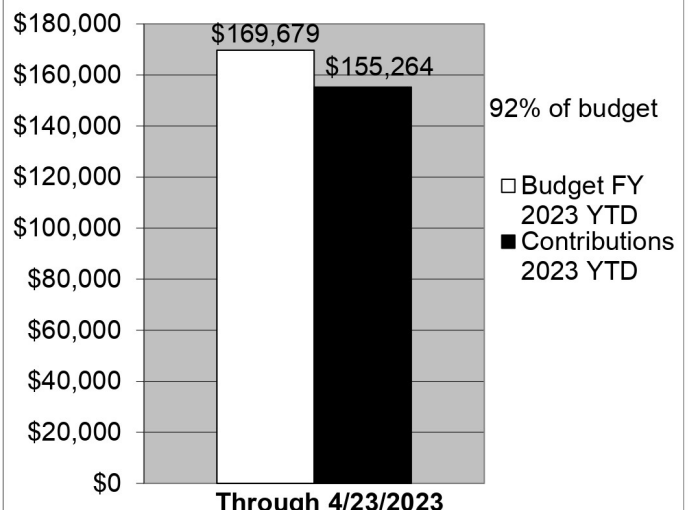

cardiologist was at least able to determine that I did have a heart! Ha...Ha...Ha.

But maybe, just maybe I'm not as tough as I think I am. My sons and Marcy have known this for years. Micah likes to call me "crybaby Kappel" when I preach. So maybe I should accept that! And I think I can, even though I come from the "big boys don't cry" generation.

But all the crying got me thinking about Mary weeping at the tomb of Jesus on Easter Sunday, and how those tears of mourning turned to joy when she saw Jesus. I also have been thinking about all the people that are weeping with me when I preach. Being reminded

of their redemption and security in their baptism, and an eternal part of Christ's sheepfold, with tears of joy running down their beards! And then I have seen the tears of mourning, regret, and pain at the loss of loved ones.

I don't know how I keep it under control in those situations. Maybe God just keeps me steady until an appropriate time I can just let it loose and cry alone. The one thing I can't get over is how good I feel after a rare, tears running down my face, gusher. I can't describe the feeling but is it close to something like relief, a weight lifted off my mind, and a baptism of my emotions.

None of that makes sense, but until it does, I'll just let it come when it does. Tears of joy, tears of frustration, tears for fear, and tears that wash the cobwebs of my mind away and gives me a new start in Christ. So, if you see me crying, don't worry, I'm just at the tomb with Mary and the joy of Jesus is right around the corner. AMEN

Stewardship News—May

Follow Him in Generosity

Our Savior calls us to follow Him in generosity. “For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you” (John 13:15). We cannot give our lives for the salvation of the world, of course. Praise God, that job’s already done! But with hearts full of thanksgiving for what Jesus has given us, we can follow His example of generous giving. And Jesus’ generosity is not merely an example. Our Lord also commands us to act according to our gifts: “The one who contributes, [let him give] in generosity” (Rom. 12:8).

So, when we bring offerings to the Lord, we should strive to heed His command and follow the pattern He has established for us. Jesus did not give us leftovers. He gave His best. We should not give leftovers, either, but the first and best of what He has given us. Jesus did not give as an afterthought — He gave according to the plan of salvation God established from the foundation of the world. So, when it comes to our own offerings, we should make a thoughtful plan to give

generously, in proportion to the way He has blessed us. Like the Macedonian Christians, who gave according to their ability, and even beyond their ability (2 Cor. 8:3), we should honor the Lord by giving a generous portion of the income that God provides us.

We should also give freely, just as Jesus gave freely for us. There is no compulsion involved in our works of love and our offerings to the Lord. We do not give grudgingly, but willingly and cheerfully, each “as he has decided in his heart,” as the Lord says (2 Cor. 9:7). There is no New Testament ceremonial law involved here. Rather, we are free to give as generously as our Savior has given for us!

In the same way, our Lord teaches us to give generously out of our love for Him and for our neighbor. Jesus shows us that genuine love is always love “in deed” (1 John 3:18). It is love that sees our neighbor in need and gives generously to help him. It is love that hears the Word of the Lord and does what it says. If we truly love, we give generously. If we give without love, our giving is

not truly following Jesus.

Finally, we follow Jesus in generosity when we support His Gospel ministry and other works of mercy. The people of Israel gave generously to construct and support the operation of the tabernacle, for that was the place where the Lord received the Old Testament sacrifices, through which He bestowed the forgiveness of sins on His people. So, they gave abundantly, so abundantly they had to be told to stop giving! (Ex. 36:5–6). In the same way, we should bring generous offerings to support the Lord’s work. We support our congregations in the preaching of His Word, Baptism and the Lord’s Supper, which bestow His gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation, and we take care of those who are poor and needy.

Our Savior calls us to follow His example in generous giving. Let us then, with thankful hearts, rededicate ourselves to following Him in generosity.
