



Genesis 4:4 – "And Abel brought the best, the choicest parts of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions. And the Lord had regard for Abel and his offering."

This passage has always been a bit of a mystery. Why did God regard Abel's offering favorably and not Cain's to the point that Cain was so enraged he killed Able.

One conclusion is that Able gave of his first fruits where Cain did not which would imply that Able gave cheerfully and Cain reluctantly.

For today's Christians we can give of our first fruits by having our offering to the church be the first line item in our budget and by not leaving it until all other expenditures have been budgeted and offer only what is left over, a practice of all too many households in today's materialistic society. By making our offering our first fruits Faith families will also have their donations regarded favorable by the Lord who loves a cheerful giver.

Pastor's Letter (cont'd)


#4. Three Days Torn, #5. Three Days on the Road. #6. Ash Wednesday/Valentine's Day will introduce our theme, and then I will be here 4 of the 6 Wednesdays to deliver them in full. As resources come out to help you with your Lent devotions, I will make them available to help us reflect penitentially in this season of Lent. But that's enough of that, moving on...

The biggest and most gratifying news for me is that Stephen Peeler came and indicated he is interested in going to seminary to become a parish pastor. He is a true son of the congregation and I have high hopes we will get him back in central Florida as a 3rd generation Floridian. Stephen can also serve as a poster boy for our campaign to raise funds for all who want to attend seminary to help with the high cost of the excellent training that is offered at both seminaries. After Lent, I will train him to assist with liturgy to start getting his feet wet. This is great news that after months and years of encouraging our sons and daughters of the congregation, we are finally seeing the first pastoral candidate that was formed here from the very beginning with our school ministry, continued with our high school ministry (way to go Mike!) and most recently with our young adult ministry (way to go Pastor Moore).

We have also received another substantial pledge to our Seminary Student Fund which will be enough to fund the rest of Joshua Wareham's seminary education and cover the entirety of Stephen's education as well. If you would like to contribute to that fund, above and beyond your tithe to the unit budget of the church, please designate your offering to the **Seminary Student Fund**. It is my goal that we keep this funded so we can get at least two seminarians to the seminary every 5-6 years to help alleviate the attrition of pastors.

With these capable young men going to seminary, we should look forward to pastors filling vacancies and faithfully serving in Word and Sacrament for years to come!


