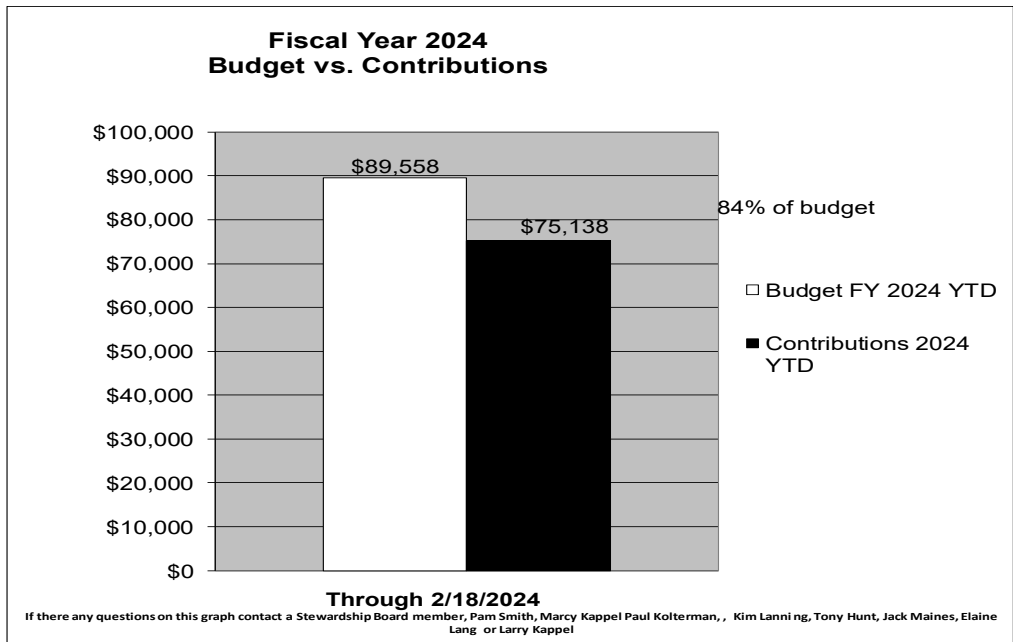

GROWING IN FAITH THROUGH STEWARDSHIP

Lack of Generosity Causes Spiritual Stiffness

“Incline my heart to your testimonies, and not to selfish gain!” (Psalm 119:36)

It’s interesting how the Psalmist contrasts God’s testimonies with selfish gain. Note, too, that there is no contrast between gain and God’s testimonies—only selfish gain.

But what makes something selfish? For the Psalmist, it has to do with the heart, since he prays “Incline my heart ... not to selfish gain!” The physical heart can do many things, but the spiritual heart does a few big things. One thing is to hold or release.

When you think of your money, does your heart hold or release? If it can release, it is not selfish gain. If it cannot, it might be lingering beneath the surface.

One way God helps us fight against grasping so tightly onto our money that it gets in the way of God’s testimonies to us is to give to the church. God tells us to do it, and he knows it is an ailment for hearts that are often inclined toward selfishness. Will Faith members and friends of Faith release their hearts and give to God as we incline our hearts toward his testimonies?

Many of our members do just that and enjoy fully God’s blessings. This is an opportunity for all members and friends of Faith to open their hearts and give generously. It is not the amount that determines selfish or generous gain, it is the spirit in which the first fruits from God are given to support the work of His bride, the church to further the Gospel to believers and non-believers alike.



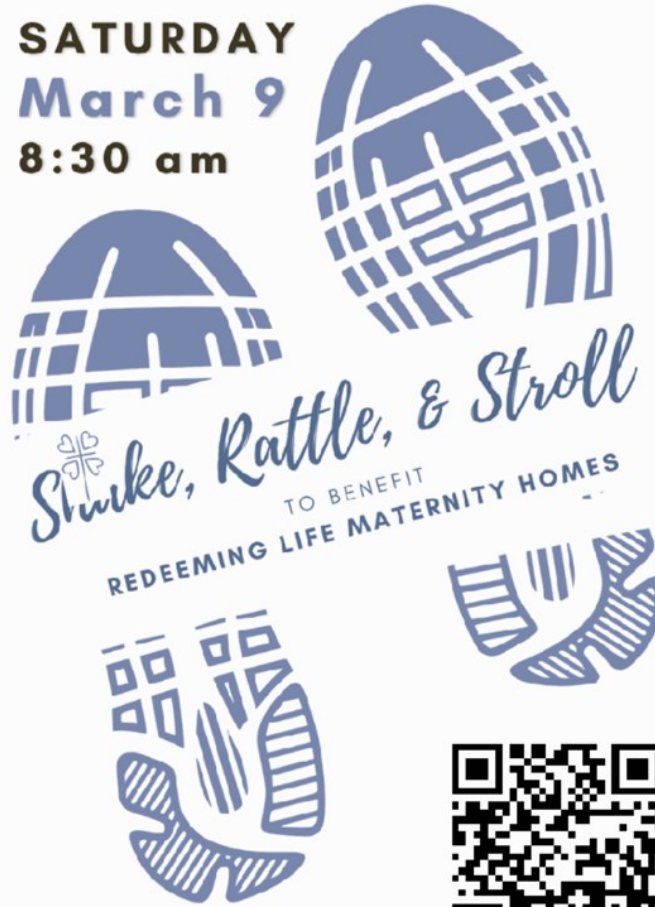
Housewarming Shower for Tiny Homes

Faith's Women's Guild is sponsoring a housewarming shower for one of the tiny homes being built in Eustis on Grove St. Forward Paths Foundation is building 10 tiny homes to house youths who are aging out of foster care at age 18. Some teens are abandoned by their parents and left to navigate on their own. They are enrolled in high school but have no permanent housing or adult supervision. They must find a job, a place to live, and transportation. Without help, very few have the resources or life skills to become successful. One in four of these youths end up incarcerated according to DCF. Forward Paths mission is to provide temporary housing, mentors to help with job skills/finding jobs, education, counseling, materials for everyday living, and donations for necessary items such as a birth certificate, drivers license, uniforms for job or school, etc. Since the tiny homes are in our own backyard, the opportunities to help this excellent organization are limitless. They are hoping to have a grand opening around May 1st. Since we believe that each home will already have furniture, our goal is to provide the rest: bedding, towels and bathroom items, stock a kitchen with dishes, pots and pans, etc. We have established a list which will be in the Narthex for folks to sign up to donate an item or two, if you wish.
